

A review of Evgenii Onegen, Rimas Tuminas' interpretation

The 9'th and 8'th grades visited the Vakhtangov theater this past Wednesday, to watch a stage adaptation of Evgenii Onegen- the novel-in-verse that the ninth grade has just finished in the last few weeks. Most of the class liked the novel, discussing it in Russian literature with Ms.Anastasia- the stage adaptation, however, is a different story.

Tuminas in his adaptation was undoubtedly very creative with how he portrayed the novel. For one- multiple people at once portrayed the same character. Perhaps the two narrators are there to show the inner-turmoil of the characters. Both Onegen and Tatiana have quite a bit of that. Onegen is the brooding bad-boy and Tatiana's double comes out only in her most troubled moment- her dream about Onegen killing Lensky. Lensky, however, doesn't have a lot of inner-turmoil, and his older narrator is more like an older brother to him, looking on at his dead body after the duel with sadness, yes, but he doesn't drop dead with the younger Lensky as Onegen kills him. Maybe he is there to show what Lensky could have been if Onegen hadn't killed him.

Some people didn't like the way Tatiana was portrayed, but I think it was actually very interesting. She's happier, more innocent. When she confesses to Onegen- it isn't a tear stained love letter, it's genuinely hopeful. Unlike some, this critic liked how the actress read the letter, she got across exactly how naïve the character must have

been, her delivery is breathy and she's constantly running around the stage.

The actual stage, however, was very lacking. The decorations were lacking to say the least. I think they could have done so much more with props- especially in Tatiana's dream sequence. That could have been the highlight of the whole show! It is so many people's favorite scene in the whole book, yet all Tatiana does in the stage adaptation

is toss around in a bed. It was very disappointing. But the biggest failure of the director was the inability to know when to stop. The first act was wonderful- sure, a bit slow, but in the second act it gets bad. It starts out great- the duel scene is very well executed, even if a bit confusing. But it gets very slow about twenty minutes into the second act. Tatiana travels to Moscow to get married and the amount of time it takes is absolutely abhorrent and unnecessary. There is a whole scene dedicated to a bunny seducing her driver that was only there to "wake up everyone who fell asleep" (-Ms.Anastasia), if you know you need something of that shock factor to entertain your audience then that means you know that the rest of your play is

boring. Tuminas, instead of addressing the problem

of his adaptation, tries to gloss it over with, frankly, unfunny and childish comedy. night's sleep. Tatiana and her husband-to-be sit on stage for ten

minutes straight while she feeds him jam! It's pointless! It adds nothing to the meaning! It doesn't serve as character development, nor does it progress the plot. Act 2 gets good again at the end, mainly thanks to Tatiana's actress, she delivers her rejection to Onegen beautifully, it's powerful and you really see how she grew as a person-she's loyal and reasonable-the former of which she always was, the ladder of which she grew into. Tatiana's actress is the best thing about the adaptation, the thirty minutes in act 2 in which she does not talk is the worst part of the

whole thing, and the show gets good again when she starts monologuing. That's too many coincidences to dismiss.

There are a lot of things I haven't mentioned in this criticism. There is an old woman in black who Ms. Anastasia theorized is the personification of fate. She shows up when Lensky and Tatiana's father die and, in the second act, when

Tatiana renounces her so-called fate of getting with Onegen, the old woman lays dead on stage until the play is over. There is a ballerina that dances with the chorus who is in a puffier dress and sometimes stands out from the crowd by messing up dance moves and bursting into song at untimely moments that I think is a reflection of Tatiana herself- a person who doesn't fit in with the norm and doesn't know how to express her feelings maturely yet. Funnily enough, this woman vanishes in the second act after Tatiana grows up. All in all, this was an interesting play, but I don't recommend going if you've had a bad night's sleep.

A Quick Interview With Olga D.

Did you like how Tatiana was portrayed? How is it different from how she is written?

I liked her a lot. It took me time to adapt to the "grown up" Tanya, but she was amazing and beautiful.

What were your favorite and least favorite parts of the play?


Most favourite- the rabbit scene, least favourite- the duel scene.

Our Plan For Japan

The Tokyo skytree is situated in Sumida city that's located northeast of the city center of Tokyo, as the tallest human made structure in Japan it rises 634 meters off the ground. It is equipped against earthquakes and painted with a custom color called "sky-white". It has two observation decks that offer

beautiful views of Tokyo. The Tokyo skytree is not only the tower, however, it is also a massive shopping and dining complex that includes museums and an aquarium that has penguins and seals. The staircase has over 2,500 steps and

there are 13 elevators to the top. (Img. 27)



Shinjuku gyoen national garden 1,100 cherry trees and consists of three separate sections- the English Landscape, the French Formal, and the Japanese Landscape. When we are there, the Double Cherry Blossom, Rhododendron, Dove Flowering Dogwood, Tree, Japanese Spiraea, and Tulip Tree will be in bloom. (Img. 28)

The most famous mountain in Japan- Fuji stands at 3,776 meters high. It is an active volcano, home to five lakes that allegedly house a sea monster named Mossie that was first spotted as a giant shadow in the 1970's. Gorgeous views spread out around the summit, though, be careful, it could erupt at any time according to Hiroki Kamata, a professor of volcanology at Kyoto University. (Img. 29)





The hike up to the main temple of Fushimi though the 10,000 red gates can take from 40 to 60 minutes. It rises 233 meters off sea level. All the guests are encouraged to leave the main deity (Inari Ōkami) an offering as a sign of respect. (Img. 30)
